# ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

It is important to understand the requirements that must be met to be considered for The Crumley House services. These include, but may not be limited to:

- Having a clinically diagnosed acquired traumatic brain injury
- Must be able to transfer independently
- Must exhibit no swallowing risk
- Must be bathroom independent
- Must not be an elopement risk
- Must be free of communal diseases


## A COOPERATIVE EFFORT

The Crumley House greatly depends on our community, our donors, and our volunteers; all working together to better the lives of brain injury survivors. One example includes key partnerships with regional colleges and universities, as well as local high schools. This teamwork creates a mutually beneficial environment where students gain hands-on experience, while Crumley House members improve upon a variety of skills via instructional and cooperative interaction.

# RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

The Crumley House provides a 365 days-per year fully functional residential program that includes living quarters, meal service, laundry, and recreation facilities.

The Residential Program is anchored by 14 single-bedroom apartments in the main building, flanked by separate men's and women's cottages that house an additional 10 members.



The Crumley House, situated on 15 acres, is located in the rural community of Limestone, half-way between the larger cities of Greeneville and Johnson City, TN.

## ADULT DAY PROGRAM

Complimenting the Residential Program, in which all members participate, The Crumley House also offers an Adult Day Program. The Day Program caters to traumatic brain injury survivors who live independently and/or have caretakers at their respective homes. Transported to The Crumley House five days per week (M-F), participants receive the same services and opportunities provided to those in the Residential Program during the hours they are on site.

# SERVICES PROVIDED

As an integral part of the rehabilitation process, a variety of services are provided and scheduled into the daily lives of our members. These services are available to those residing in our independent living apartments, our transitional living facilities, and our adult day program. These include, but are not limited to:

# ABOUT THE CRUMLEY HOUSE


The Crumley House Brain Injury Rehabilitation Center is a certified 501(c)(3) non-profit organization providing Residential Services, an Adult Day Program, and Service Coordination Programs specifically geared to serve the individual needs of those who have acquired and survived a traumatic brain injury.

## BY THE NUMBERS

Each year, more than 2.8 million individuals sustain a traumatic brain injury in the United States. Currently, more than six million in the U.S. are living with a permanent disability due to a traumatic brain injury.

Since 1992, The Crumley House has served more than 3,000 brain injury survivors and their families.

Currently, The Crumley House serves members from nine states.



# THE CRUMLEY HOUSE ORIGIN STORY

On one September afternoon, the lives of then 14-year-old Lori Beth Ford and her family were dramatically and forever altered.

Following a tragic automobile accident, the vibrant, beautiful, and talented teenager became a traumatic brain injury survivor. Through Lori Beth's recovery process, her mother and founder of The Crumley House, the late Mrs. June Barrett, discovered a great need as well as a wonderful opportunity to help others.

There simply were no services, nor facilities to support the transition between acute rehabilitation, community re-entry and development of independent living skills. In 1992, June Barrett opened the doors to The Crumley House as an act of love, and it continues to be so today, passionately serving traumatic brain injury survivors and their families.
